

SmartTalk key features

SmartTalk is a turnkey push-to-talk solution for mobile devices and PCs. SmartTalk-enabled phones can communicate like radiotelephones but without range limitation or security issues.

SmartTalk's unique feature is its compatibility with existing, commercially available handsets. In the most compatible modes, groups and one-to-one calls, interoperability is seamless between Nokia proprietary and Open Mobile Alliance compatible push-to-talk phones.

Compatible devices

Most Nokia S60 and some S40 phones manufactured after 2005 come with a factory-installed Push-over-Cellular application, also some Sonim models. These phones can be provisioned to SmartTalk service by sending a single configuration SMS to phone.

Some phones come with a factory-installed PoC application that is compatible with Open Mobile Alliance (OMA) specifications. For example, Sonim XP1/XP3 and Nokia 6210 Navigator are compatible with SmartTalk.

Windows Mobile phones without a PoC application can be provisioned to the system by installing one.

Flexible and easy to use

SmartTalk is a flexible, operator-independent solution that is remarkably easy to use. Hold the button and talk, and group members can hear without needing to answer.

Groups can be created from the phone or the web. The most common group type is chat group, which can be public or private. Chat group is compatible with all phones that can connect to a server.

Ad hoc groups are available for OMA phones. Formed for special purposes, these groups exist once they have been created and disappear when the last member of the group logs off.
